Thank you for continuing to consult with the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP). We have reviewed the project in accordance with the New York State Historic Preservation Act of 1980 (Section 14.09 of the New York State Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation Law). These comments are those of the OPRHP and relate only to Historic/Cultural resources. They do not include potential environmental impacts to New York State parkland that may be involved in or near the project. Such impacts must be considered as part of the environmental review of the project pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York Conservation Law, Article 8) and its implementing regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617).

We have reviewed the following information provided on 23 October 2019 in response to my letter of 10 September 2019:

- Letter response with detailed project description from Barry Medenbach (M&E Engineering) to Nancy Herter (OPRHP) dated 23 October 2019.
- Archaeological Investigation report prepared by Joseph E. Diamond, Ph.D. dated 4 October 2019.

This additional information addresses the requests in our 10 September 2019 letter. Based on review of this additional information, it is the opinion of the OPRHP that the proposed project to construct two 120,000 square foot manufacturing buildings on this former quarry site is in an area with no archaeological and/or historic resources listed in or eligible for the New York State and National Registers of Historic Places. Therefore, it is the opinion of OPRHP that the project will have **No Impact** Registers-eligible resources.
